- Onshore Water Treatment Facilities & Distribution Systems**
These locate, manage, and clean local water sources using the latest equipment, technologies, and science. Through them, water is supplied to homes, schools, and businesses for consumption and other uses.
- Wastewater Collection & Water Resource Recovery Facilities**
Using the latest technologies, equipment, and science, these remove chemicals and pollutants, as well as recover key nutrients and resources from used water. The cleaned water is returned to streams, rivers and lakes or used for irrigation.
- Water Protection Agencies**
Operate on a federal, state, and local level to test water for pollutants, protect wetlands and water supplies, as well as enforce regulations.
- Auxiliary Organizations**
Support and assist the Water Environment Industry through industry specific products, equipment, and services.
